


- But we are facing significant Challenges














2019 NATIONAL NET INCOME VS 2020 BUDGET

Total 2019 Net Income Vs 2020 Budget








Revised DanceSport Goals – 2020

- Revise Rulebook to Improve Readability, Remove Inconsistencies, and Facilitate Competition
- Automate Ranking Point System

Professional Council's Projects for 2020 and Beyond

- Communication The Professional Council would like to develop methods by which to reach out and communicate with:
 - Chapters and Social members to show our support and appreciation of social dancing has been done in the YM forum videos – Stuck at Home.
 - USA Dance Members and non-members to promote National Ballroom Dance Week as has been done with flash mob choreography since 2017.
 - USA Dance Professionals and how they can help build our organization.
- Work with our competition organizers and their Canadian counterparts to build a North American Competition circuit.
- Adjudicator's Education organizing an American Smooth and Rhythm Congress emphasizing the different skills needed to judge both effectively.
- Pro/Am to continue build this program as a vital part of our organization benefiting both amateurs and professionals.



Professional Council's Examination Department Report

- New Adjudicators 3 candidates are in the process
- Reactivated Officials 3
- Reactivated Adjudicators 1
- New Invigilators 1
- New Scrutineers 2
- New WDSF Adjudicators 4
- WDSF Upgrades 1, (1) in process
- WDSF Technical Exams given 2
- USA Dance Conversion Exams given 3
- All active adjudicators have met the SafeSport and background check requirements.
- Adjudicator Letter and WDSF Applications have been placed on the Professional Council page of USA Dance website.
- WDSF Congress was held January 29 & 30th in Atlanta, Georgia. The Chairperson's Congress had 6 attendee's all from the US. The Adjudicators Congress had 28 attendees from the US, Canada and Armenia.
- Testing materials outlining procedure and exams have been created for USA Dance Conversion Exams for American Smooth, Rhythm, Standard and Latin. The Invigilation Exam has been written for those adjudicators wishing to become Invigilators.
- An Examination Department document library has been created and maintained to secure a permanent place for all our adjudication exams, adjudication exam results, and requirements passed. This is a major step forward in establishing a continuity between administrations.



Professional Council's Organizer Committee Report

Accomplishments:

- Many Organizers completed a survey sent to update their competition details, contact info, address any
 concerns and request suggestions to help improve their events.
- Two Conference calls with multiple organizers: Nov '19 & March '20.
- A delegate from the Gender Neutral Committee joined the March '20 call to answer organizer concerns and questions.
- Addressed and resolved concerns with the advertising of USA Dance competitions through email and the USA Dance website.
- Formulating, in conjunction with the PC & DSC, recommendations for existing and new events to retain or acquire NQE status.

2020 Goals:

- Work closely with organizers to help them integrate the Gender Neutral events into their competitions and other logistical needs.
- Clarification and replacement of ambiguous wording within rules affecting competitions.
- Formation of a pamphlet promoting the organizing of USA Dance competitions, and recommendations on how to organize a successful event.
- Finalize, in conjunction with the PC & DSC, requirements for existing and new events to retain or acquire NQE status.






